## ANSWERS TO THE QUESTIONS

### DO YOU KNOW WHO THE PARK WAS NAMED AFTER?



The park was named after **Sir Robert Peel** the former prime minister (1834-1835 and 1841-1846). The subscription was strongly supported by Sir Robert Peel, who fought to increase the number of parks in Manchester and Salford.



### PEEL PARK WAS OPENED IN 1846, DO YOU KNOW WHY IT WAS OPENED?

In the late 18<sup>th</sup> and early 19<sup>th</sup> century, Salford underwent immense industrial growth, meaning that open spaces that once dominated England were becoming sparse within cities.

Groups of people within Salford and Manchester realised the importance of these spaces for health and happiness, so they began gain support from the people and the Committee for Public Walks, Gardens and Playgrounds was created after seven years.

The committee gained donations, known as subscriptions, to fund the parks and spaces. Peel Park was opened in **1846** as the first public park in the United Kingdom, on the former Lark Hill Estate.

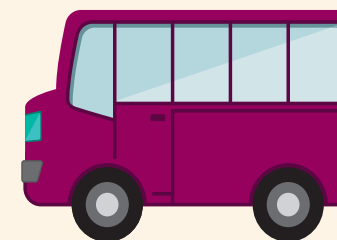
## GETTING TO PEEL PARK
